About the ACS

- Annual U.S. Census Bureau Survey
- Sent to a sample of about 3.5 million addresses in the 50 states, District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico
- High response rate
- Designed to provide current information to communities each year

Why the ACS?

- Includes six disability questions
- Covers a wide variety of topics:
 - Employment
 - Poverty
 - Occupation
 - Housing
- Consistent disability measures over time (2008-2023)
- Supports local level estimates



Disability in the ACS

"Any disability": Reporting one or more of the six disability types:

- Visual (all ages)
- Hearing (all ages)
- Ambulatory (ages 5+)
- Cognitive (ages 5+)
- Self-Care (ages 5+)
- Independent living (ages 15+)



ACS <u>Census</u> Estimates (5-year)

Description

ACS Census 5-Year Estimates are based on estimates from tables generated by the Census Bureau. These estimates are based on data compiled over a 5-year period; that is, the 2023 5-year Estimates use data collected from 2018 to 2023.

Benefits

- Best for estimates for small, substate areas (e.g., counties)
- Topics are more limited
- Combines 5 years of data



ACS <u>Custom</u> Estimates (1-year)

Description

ACS Custom 1-Year Estimates are generated by the Yang-Tan Institute on Employment and Disability at Cornell University using the 1-year ACS Public Use Microdata Sample (PUMS) data.

Benefits

- Best for national and state level estimates
- Based on the most current data available
- More topics and demographic breakdowns than Census Bureau Estimates



Why 5-year Census Estimates?

Provides Local Data

- Census Bureau 1-year estimates are limited to areas with a minimum total population of 65,000
- Only 680 of the 3,145 counties in the U.S. meet that criteria
- Missing nearly 80% of counties
- 5-year Census Bureau tables allow us to provide estimates for ALL counties (and eventually other geographic entities).

Limitations

Not as timely/current



Custom 1-Year vs. Census 5-Year Estimates

U.S. Employment Rate Example:

• 2023 ACS Census Bureau 5-year Estimate (2019-2023 data):

41.8% Employment Rate

(non-institutionalized civilians with disabilities ages 18-64)

2023 ACS Custom 1-Year Estimate:


46.5% Employment Rate


(non-institutionalized with disabilities ages 18-64)
